New Mexico State University, Las Cruces

You can fly into El Paso, Texas and drive 45-minutes north or fly into Albuquerque and drive 2-hours south. From El Paso there is a shuttle bus service to Las Cruces. **GET AN ADVANCED RESERVATION FROM LAS CRUCES SHUTTLE TO GET ON THAT BUS.** They charge extra for walk-ons or last minute phone calls at the airport. When you make that reservation be sure to make it round-trip, so you'll be reserved both ways. It's to be about \$90 RT.

When you reserve, you'll tell them your flight arrival/departure times, originating city, and airline. **FIND THEM OUTSIDE BAGGAGE CLAIM IN THE GROUND TRANSPORTATION AREA.** They seem to run about every 2-hours from 6am – 9:30, but they will match you up with a run based on your desired flight times.

In Las Cruces, they normally arrive at a terminal downtown, but for \$9 they'll drop-off/pick-up at the college. Be sure to let them know you want to go to NMSU when you reserve.

If driving, expand the campus map to include Las Cruces and El Paso along I-10 and Albuquerque to the north.

Lodging

We will stay in Pinion Hall on campus, a short walk from the theater. When you inform me of your travel plans I will reserve and hold your room. I will bill you through PayPal for the week's room price, which runs \$35 per night. Rooms are private, though you may have two beds.

Meal Planning

The Intensive runs 8:45 am to 9pm. There's an extra day for Teacher Candidates on Saturday, 9am – 6pm. It's a physical workshop demanding physical activity so drink a lot. We begin at 8:45am with warm-ups. Breakfast before hand. There are meal locations across from the theater, and some will have cars for ridesharing. Bring foods if you'd like for the kitchen. There are morning and afternoon breaks and liberal lunch and dinner breaks. Meals are your responsibility. You do not need a car and generally will only need money for food.
